Summary of key points in report

Key areas covered in this report are outlined below:

External Audit provision

A separate item is provided in the confidential session on proposals regarding External Audit provision.

Governor Observers of Board subcommittees:

A key role for Governors is to hold the Non-Executive Directors to account. Formal opportunities for engagement for Governors with Non-Executive Directors (NEDs) takes place through discussion with NEDs at Council of Governors meetings, or through observing NEDs fulfilling their role in holding the Executive to Account at Board Assurance Committee meetings and at Board of Directors public meetings. Chairs of the Board Assurance Committees provide presentations back to the Council of Governors on the work of their committees during the course of the year.

Governors are encouraged to attend and observe the public Board of Directors meetings for which dates have been shared.

The NEDs also triangulate what the information and assurance they receive through intelligence they obtain from visiting services and engagement in other activity and with teams across the organisation and this feeds into their discussions at the committees and Board.

To support Governors in observing NEDs in action, and seeing their work chairing and participating in board assurance committees Governors are offered the opportunity to observe these and we have individuals currently in place to do so.

Details of the board subcommittees and the governors who have observed the committees from February

2023 are listed below. These meetings have taken place via Teams and in some cases we are now using a hybrid approach.

The Council of Governors agreed we would review the arrangement with the potential to enable other Governors to rotate in, as committee observers.

As such Governors (including those currently observing committees) are asked to express an interest in observing any of the board sub-committees to the Director of Corporate Governance by the end of January 2024; with the aim of a recommendation to go to Council of Governors in February on observation arrangements for the next financial year.

Declarations of Interest 2023-2024

As per our Managing Conflicts of Interest in the NHS policy all governors are responsible for ensuring that they are not placed in a position which risks, or appears to risk, conflict between their private interests and their governor duties.

Every year we call in updated declarations of interest from Governors so that the registers can be updated and reported to the Audit and Risk committee. The reporting schedule is such that we must provide updated declarations to the Audit and Risk Committee meeting in May and will be calling in updated declarations between now and the end of March 2024.

The Head of Corporate Assurance will email all governors with a copy of their previous declarations, with a request to update these and return the forms to support this requirement for onward reporting to Audit and Risk Committee.
