Summary of key points in report

The National Health Service (Quality Accounts) Regulations 2010 set out the requirements for NHS Trusts to produce and publish an Annual Quality Report. As part of this Quality Report, NHS Trusts must include a description of future areas for improvement (the Quality Objectives). The Quality Objectives that have been in place within SHSC were developed in 2021 and were three-year objectives. 2023/24 is the final year of the actions which aim to deliver the current overarching objectives.

These are:

- Demonstrate a measurable and equitable reduction in the use of seclusion and restraint.
- Demonstrate improvements in the number of people from diverse communities accessing communitybased mental health services.
- Embed co-production with service users and carers in how we deliver and govern clinical services.

We need to look ahead to 2024/27 to develop new three-year objectives. It is crucial that stakeholder involvement from numerous groups/bodies, both internal and external occurs to help shape our quality objectives. Appendix 1 sets out suggested priorities using a variety of sources, both internal and external areas requiring improvement. Following the Council of Governors discussion, wider consultation will take place before the objectives are firmed up and ultimately approved through the Quality Assurance Committee.

Suggestions for priorities for 2024/27 (1)

- Sexual safety Improving sexual safety for service users, particularly in inpatient areas
- Neurodiversity Ensuring individual needs are identified and person-centred care is delivered for service users
- Dementia developing a strategic organisational approach to Dementia aligned to regulatory focus





Suggestions for priorities for 2024/27 (2)

 Patient level reporting including psychological responses and support for service users following trauma experienced in SHSC
